Dear Parents and Carers,

Over the last term we have been preparing arrangements for next year's classes.

I am delighted to inform you that we shall be operating as single year classes again. Children in current years 3-6 will remain in their existing class groups but children in EYFS, year 1 and year 2 will be mixed within their year groups. I do understand this sometimes is a concern for parents but please be assured great care is taken to consider a number of factors when making these changes and always in the best interests of the children. Our school continues to grow in popularity and numbers. In September 2018, it is likely that there will be in excess of 300 children on roll. Foundation Stage will be a cohort of 45 children and we shall be welcoming children who will be joining us further up the school.

In addition to the staff mentioned above, Mrs. Baker, our specialist PE teacher, will continue to deliver high quality PE teaching and staff training as well as tournament opportunities for our children with Mr. Clark. Mrs. Radbourne will continue to teach Spanish to KS2 and French to KS1. Mrs. Clissold will support phonics teaching in KS1. As a lead school for School Direct and working with Brookes University, we shall also be hosting student teachers during the year. Numbers have still to be finalised and details will follow. On Tuesday 10th July, there will be an opportunity for your child to meet his/her new class teacher for 'Transition Morning'. Children will arrive at school as usual and will visit their new class and teacher from 9.15 – 11.45 am. This is an opportunity for staff and children to get to know one another and to find out about the exciting activities planned for the year ahead.

On the afternoon of 10th July, from 3.15 – 4.00 pm, we shall be holding a 'Transition Afternoon'. This is an informal opportunity for parents and carers to introduce themselves to their child's new class teacher and to discuss any information which may be helpful for the class teacher to know in advance of the new academic year. Parents and carers will be informed of their child's new class in a letter on Monday 9th July.

The annual reports to parents will be sent out this Friday to all classes except year 6 who will get their reports when we receive the SATs information on the Tuesday 10th July.
