School Improvement

On January 21st we had a 'Mocksted' visit in school. This visit consisted of three inspectors from the diocese and was requested by the governing body to evaluate any areas for development in school. It was very helpful and validated what we had already identified in our school development plan. I have listed the key findings below for your information.

- Leaders at St Andrew's seek to be "restless and visionary" for their pupils. They are determined to ensure that they continue to deliver strong provision for all pupils
- Changes to leadership in the school have provided fresh opportunity to consider the provision, and how the school's articulation of its vision can ensure that all stakeholders understand and can contribute to continuing improvements
- Relationships between pupils and adults are strong. Teachers and other adults are kind and respectful, children feel safe, and any issues are handled in a calm and measured manner
- Attainment at KS2 in Reading, Writing and Mathematics (RWM) combined is well above the national at Expected +; and at KS1 in R, W, and M attainment is high. GD combined at KS2 is only slightly above national and average point scores for reading and mathematics at KS2 are not significantly above the national. Progress from KS1 to KS2 is average, all above 0 for the 2018 cohort
- Governors are committed to supporting the school to be the best that it can be, and to ensure that they are equipped with the right information to take strategic decisions
