

Maths

Our focus is on time. We will practise reading the time on analogue and digital clocks. We will measure times in seconds and minutes, and go on to tell the time using 24 hour clocks. The children will also do work on measurement, using cm, mm and m, and finding the perimeter of different shapes.

History

We will learn about the causes of World War 2, and the effects on children.

Music

Science

We will learn about science investigations. Children will carry out a number of tests, looking at interpreting their results and making a fair test. We will practise controlling variables and drawing tables to record results in.
